Significant Alarms

Residential Fire

On February 16, the East Battalion had a defensive residential fire on Woods Creek Road. B31, E31, E32, E33, M31, L71 E41, MSO 71 and B43 responded. The initial units arrived to find a fully involved residential structure. The crews performed a defensive fire attack and quickly controlled the fire. There was one citizen who suffered smoke inhalation injuries due to the fire. M31 performed patient care and transported the patient. The fire is currently under investigation by the Snohomish County Fire Marshal. Great job by all crews involved.

At the same time as the residential fire on Woods Creek Road, SCFD #5 had a residential fire on Woods Lake Road. Units T83 and M82 assisted SCFD #5 with the residential fire on Woods Lake Road.

Fire Suppression / Special Operations

Auto Extrication Training / Demonstration

On February 8, North Battalion C-shift coordinated an auto-extrication demonstration at Braven Metals for the Brighton School. Thirty-two students received a tour of Braven Metals and the North Battalion crews gave the students an auto-extrication demonstration. This was a great opportunity to perform training and support Braven Metals. Braven Metals has been a supportive partner for SRFR by providing vehicles at no charge to perform auto-extrication training.

Inflatable Rescue Boat Operator Training

Three boat operators attended a four-day Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) Operator Class in Red Bluff, California, on the Sacramento River with other operators on the west coast. They learned the operations, capabilities, limitations, and the maintenance of Boat 82 in both static and



dynamic waters. The three operators who attended the training will be building a curriculum for SRFR boat operators with the plan to deliver this training to all current boat operators.

The Training Division has scheduled 12 members to conduct Tiller Training starting in April and ending in May. Logistics will also be sending some members through the training to aid in moving the TDA for maintenance. The training will consist of five days of training per operator.

The Training Division is in the process of scheduling a spring Pump Academy for anyone wishing to be an Acting Driver/Officer in the future.

Blue Card Incident Management Training

Eight members completed a Blue Card Incident Management Train the Trainer Course and are now certified to instruct Blue Card Classes. The bill has since made it out of the Finance Committee and is on to the Rules Committee.
