Firefighters stop fire from spreading throughout home

[Bothell, WA] – At 10:15 pm firefighters were dispatched to a report of a residential structure fire at the 4600 block of 151^{st} Place SE in Bothell. Units arrived on scene to find fire coming from the first and second floors of the single family home with fire extending into the attic.

The crews initial attack was from the outside of the home, then they worked inside to fully extinguish the fire. The fire significantly damaged the home, but firefighters were able to save some personal belongings.



Neighbors reported the fire. No one was home when the fire started and there were no injuries.

The Snohomish County Fire Marshal's Office is investigating what started the fire.
