Firefighters work to extinguish scrap metal fire

[Clearview, WA] – Firefighters were dispatched at 6:20 am this morning to a report of smoke in the area of the 18800 block of Yew Way. Responders searched and found a scrap metal pile at a recycling facility that was on fire.

The response was upgraded to add additional fire resources. Firefighters have been working defensively to control the 50' x 50' scrap metal pile. Heavy machinery will be assisting firefighters throughout the day to break apart the pile and extinguish the fire.

Residents living near or downwind of the fire should close their windows and doors to avoid breathing in the smoke.

The cause of the fire is unknown. No injuries have been reported.
