## Firefighter's passing determined as Line of Duty Death

[Monroe, WA] – In 2018, Fire District 7 reported the unexpected loss of one of their own, firefighter/paramedic Erik Shouse. His death was reviewed by Labor and Industries and through that process, determined to be a Line of Duty Death due to occupational disease.

As a Line of Duty Death, firefighter/paramedic Shouse will be honored at additional memorial services held in 2020.
