Residential Fire

On January 1, 2023, SRFR units responded to a two-story house with a working fire in the West Battalion. The first arriving unit, E72, reported that they had a victim in the driveway and were performing CPR. B71 established command and assigned units to both fire control and to assist with CPR. The homeowner was resuscitated and transported to Evergreen Hospital in Kirkland. The crews performed an offensive fire attack and completed a primary search. Unfortunately, the crews found two dogs that were deceased due to the fire and smoke. The fire is under investigation by the Snohomish County Fire Marshal's Office.

Childbirth

M81 and M82 responded with Marysville Fire units to a possible childbirth in the North Battalion. E66 began providing care to a child that had just been delivered at home. M81 arrived shortly after E66 and assisted with patient care until the arrival of the midwife. This was a planned at-home birth. The delivery was faster than expected, however, mother and baby were healthy.
