Emergency Medical Services

Recertifications

The EMS Division successfully recertified 52 members over the past several months. It is a detailed process to ensure all appropriate training was completed and documented. Staff worked collaboratively with Snohomish County EMS to file the documentation with the State of Washington.

Ultrasound

The EMS Division has begun to use an ultrasound device in the field during cardiac arrests. There has been positive feedback since its implementation. The EMS Division believes that the ultrasound will have a positive impact on patient care for the citizens of SRFR.

EMS Interlocal Agreements Snohomish County Fire District 5 and 17

The EMS Division has been working with SCFD 5 and 17 to complete interlocal agreements that would allow their new medics to be mentored and ride with SRFR paramedics. SRFR has been working with Brian Snure to draw up the agreements. We look forward to providing our neighbors with professional training and mentorship.

Our 14 new recruits and two company officers (Steve Kuhlman and Matt Nuttbrock) started the Snohomish County Fire Training Academy on February 6th. Most of the training will be conducted at Snohomish County Fire District 4's Training Facility in Snohomish.
