# **Training & Safety**

## **Grant Applications Approved**

The Health & Safety Committee and the Emergency Medical Division were informed that our grant application with Labor and Industries has been approved and will allow us to purchase the Sampson Lifting straps that are currently being trialed on Medic 31 and Aid 82. These straps will be placed on all first out apparatus.



The Health & Safety Division also obtained grant approval for cabinet gear dryers for stations that do not have proper drying areas. The Health & Safety committee has recognized four stations to start with that can utilize these PPE gear dryers based on the highest risk and availability of power/space requirements. Stations 73, 77, 82, and 33 will be receiving new gear dryers by the end of the year.

# **Support Services**

## Logistics

#### Station 83

The contractor is working on interior painting and beginning case work. HVAC and plumbing trim will also be installed. On the exterior, siding has been started and the generator has been set. We are scheduled for an early September punch list inspection and a substantial completion date of September 16th. Logistics will need at least a week to set up furniture.

#### **Station 31 Shop Remodel**

We have officially broken ground over the last two weeks to improve the shop at Station 31. Gencap continues to make great early progress. This week the footings will be poured, and the water main relocation will be performed.

#### Stations 32 and 81

BNB/Miller Hull: The commissioners will be presented a draft contract for construction and architectural services using progressive design build on Thursday. Once executed, the design team will begin site assessments and early design.

Station 81: We have a finalized agreement for the mutual stormwater vault for the Station 81 project between SRFR, City of Lake Stevens and North Cove, LLC.

Station 32 Property: We have extended our due diligence on the Station 32 property by 60 days and will continue to work on confirming whether the property is conducive to our needs.

#### Station 72

We continue to pump the tanks weekly and monitor septic levels. Crews are doing a great job of watching water usage.

Harmsen has completed the survey for Station 72 that was requested by the engineers. The engineers will now prepare a proposal for SRFR to complete the sewer hookup and possibly help with a developer extension agreement to hookup water. We did get notification from Alderwood Water that the original location for the water main connection will not work, and we will have to do some further research on other options. The issue is all the water lines surrounding the station are transmission lines and too big to have a 1" service tapped off them. We may need to have the engineer who will be working on our sewer design look at this as well.



# **Training Property**

The training property that was originally purchased by District 7 leadership and located off State Route 522 has closed and is officially no longer in our possession. The district has received payment from the home builder.

# **Administration Building**

We are currently working on placing a furniture order for the new upstairs area in the Administration Building for the Training, Information Technology and the Fire Marshal Divisions. The current plan is to have the move made by October 1st.

Creating Friends provides an opportunity for kids of all abilities, personalities and backgrounds to spend a day creating art and enjoying food, music and games together.
