Significant Alarms

Technical Rescue

On October 15th, East Battalion units responded to a fall above the Skykomish River. B31 arrived to find the reporting party on the shoulder of Ben Howard Road, who then brought B31 to location where their friend had fallen. B31 was able to hear and see the person who fell, waving her hand approximately 100 feet down the embankment, just above the cliff side that went down to the river.

B31 assumed Ben Howard Command. E31 and A32's crews set up an anchor system and used a rope to make access to the person who fell. After falling down the hill, the person landed in the last small level spot before going over the steep cliff and approximately 80 feet down to the riverbank. The person could stand in the small area but was not secure. The crew was able to put her into a harness and anchor her to the rope, so she did not fall any further. With the help of the two rescuers who initially made contact, they were able to get her up the hill and to a spot where she could walk assisted to the top where she had originally fallen from. The person was not injured and did not want or need medical care.

Fire Investigation

The OFM has aquired Blazestack Fire Investigation Case Management Software. This software helps the OFM to complete casework per NFPA 921 and 1033 standards. Lt/DFM LeDuc was the first to use the software after completing an investigation recently in Lake Stevens.
